**What is the hate crime
situation in Norway?**

A total of about 250 cases are registered
with the police annually.

A survey done by the police showed that
3 % of the respondents had experienced
hate crime.

Why are they not reported?



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A British survey showed that amongst LGB-people that had experienced hate crime;

- 8 out of ten had not reported this to the police
- 1/6 said it happened so often to bother reporting
- 1/3 said they didn't think the police wouldn't take it seriously anyway
- 1 out of ten were afraid of being met by homophobia
- more than 40 % didn't know that what they had experienced would be characterized as hate crime



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How can an NGO such as LLH work on this issue?

- We knew that the actual numbers were higher
- How to make more people report

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Pink Competency Justice


- Police training
